
Izzie needs a hero. She was adopted as a puppy, and thought she had a home. Now six years later, through no fault of her own, and when her chances of being adopted are much Story slimmer, Izzie is desperate to find a place to call her own.

When an animal is badly abused, set on fire, or otherwise tortured, offers of help immediately pour in. But each day.

thousands of animals are quietly given up to animal shelters. Some of them have been in multiple homes by the time they reach adulthood. Others, like Izzie, have

spent years with the same people, only to be jettisoned during normal life changes such as moving or having a baby. Their stories get little attention, but due to the sheer number of them, perhaps they are the ones that should shock us the most.

While it's become trendy to call it "re-homing," that's a rather soft word for the harsh reality of what the cat or dog in question will experience. We don't like the term because it seems to gloss over the fact that pets are living beings with feelings and emotions, not items to be discarded or recycled. What the word really means is that an animal will be confused, scared, and anxious when everything they have ever known is ripped from



And this is what Izzie is going through right now. She doesn't understand what's happening, why she is surrounded by strangers, or why her world has suddenly changed. She is a good dog, very calm, smart, and well-mannered. She loves her toys and has never had an accident in the house. She enjoys walking, and a fenced yard would be heaven for her. She's an introvert by nature, so would probably do best with quiet people who live a low-key lifestyle. Like most of us, she's not perfect; she isn't crazy about being left alone for long periods, prefers people she knows, and likes to choose her own dog friends. She will bond tightly when she finds someone who understands her.

Adopting animals like Izzie are what it takes to truly have a "no-kill nation". If no one steps forward to adopt the older animals or ones who require special consideration, we cannot progress.

Unlike some dogs who are abused, mistreated, or abandoned, Izzie's story is much more subtle. The suffering is emotional rather than physical, but it is there all the same. Every homeless dog needs a hero. Izzie is waiting.
