# This Year's Walk is **Dedicated to Tiki**

Tiki was surrendered to our Rescue Program with a painful spinal injury that was affecting her ability to walk. Her previous owner had been told she required expensive surgery, a long recovery period, and lifestyle changes that the owner couldn't accommodate. In preparation for the surgery, we sent her to a neurologist. After a short course of medicine the issue



completely resolved and surgery was not required. In addition to the disc disease, Tiki also had skin, eye and ear issues that cleared up with a quality food. Most rescue dogs don't have this many issues but when they come from "a breeder in Missouri" like Tiki did. it is cause for alarm. Missouri is known as a "Puppy Mill Capital" and "breeder in Missouri" is often a euphemism for a puppy mill.

Tiki was doing great, but then her Foster Mom found a lump in her mammary tissue. Because we knew she had not been spayed until she was an adult, which increases the risk of mammary cancer, this was a concern. So off she went to the vet again. The mass was surgically removed and was malignant. Soon an additional mass appeared on her lung. Her Foster Parents became her Forever Parents and Tiki travelled out of state to a prestigious teaching hospital for the best treatment they could find. Every specialist she saw, from the surgeon to the oncologist said "It's such a shame because of all of the cancers a dog could get, this is the only one that is almost 100% preventable if a dog is spayed before her first heat. And yet still people wait too long to spay their pets."

Like all pets when they're given up, Tiki had been depressed, stressed, and confused. But with patience, she blossomed into a funny girl with a huge fan club. All the attention, pink beds, and glittery collars brought out her inner diva. She loved her toys, working out with mom, yelling at intruders, and making her people smile. They fell in love, fast and hard. Tiki died in the arms of her heartbroken family, just a few months later. She was only 6 years old.

Every time you have a pet, you begin a journey, and each one is unique. Tiki's parents say that while their journey was brief, it was very meaningful, and an important one to share. Although they loved her the minute they laid eyes on her, they weren't sure it was time for a pet. Sometimes fate intervenes and places us each where we are supposed to be, for a reason. "Tiki was meant to be with us, and we were meant to be with her. It hurts to have lost her but it hurts more to think about all the pets whose owners abandon them when the going gets tough. Every pet deserves to leave this world surrounded by people who love them. That's why we're walking this year, to help ensure that more animals be given that chance".
